# Julie Henry – Going Down

On side-by-side screens Going Down shows the 'home' and 'away' spectators at a Premier League football match in London. Possibly the greatest work of art ever made on the subject of sport, Going Down is 90 seconds of contemporary agony and ecstasy in football.

### Martin Parr - Think of England

Photographs by England's pre-eminent social-documentarian show the English at their leisure. Parr lives in Bristol and is a member of Magnum, the global photo agency. His England is charming in an other-worldly way, sometimes decaying before our eyes, product-obsessed, arcanely ritualistic and, overall, a place where the seagulls look healthier than the people. His framing and use of foregrounded fragments capture hidden meanings and eternal truths simultaneously.

### Nina Toft - "The one I think I am..."

A new video work by an emerging Edinburgh artist shows commuters at a rail station on their way to work; it captures the existential dilemma of working in the contemporary world in semi-confrontational portraits that mimic the work of the paparazzi. A work that is about many things, including the hidden beauty of our daily resignation to the working life.

**NEW BOOKS:** Presentation House Gallery is publishing **two new books** on the occasion of these exhibitions. Julie Henry's 'Going Down' has a **36 page colour catalogue** with texts by Steven Bode from the Film & Video Umbrella in London and Bill Jeffries. Nina Toft's "The one I think I am..." also has a **36 page colour catalogue** with texts by Shane Danielsen, the Director of the Edinburgh International Film Festival, and Bill Jeffries.

These exhibitions are curated by Bill Jeffries. **They are part of "UK Today: A New View",** a city-wide series of presentations of new art, theatre and music from the UK.
